Commissioner Donna Adams

Donna Adams has been a police officer for 35 years and commenced in the role as Commissioner of Police and Secretary of the Department of Police, Fire and Emergency

Management on the 11 October 2022. Most recently, Donna was Deputy Commissioner of Police for 15 months and prior to that, Deputy Secretary of the Department for 6 years. Donna has also been recognised with an Australian Police Medal for Distinguished Service and the Tasmania Police Service Medal for diligent and ethical service. Donna received a Commissioner's Commendation for her work in the aftermath of the devastating 1996 Port Arthur massacre, and has been recognised by the Australasian Council of Women in Policing as an outstanding investigator. In the Australia Day 2023 Honours list, Donna has been awarded with The Public Service Medal for outstanding public service through leadership during the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2014, Donna was the Tasmanian Telstra Business Woman of the Year and went on to become a joint National winner of the Telstra Business Women Innovation Award. Donna in her role as Deputy Secretary of the Department of Police, Fire and Emergency Management played a key role in leading the integration of separate policing and fire business and corporate services into a combined business department. In 2019, Donna was appointed by the Head of the State Service as the Lead Negotiator to resolve a long-standing pay dispute involving ten unions. In 2020, Donna was seconded to the Department of Health as the Emergency Operations Commander for Tasmania Health Services in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Donna has a Graduate Certificate in Police Studies (2002), Graduate Certificate in Applied Management (2007) and a Master in Policing (2011).

John has been heavily involved in domestic and international disaster assistance for 25 years deploying to disasters nationally and internationally on numerous occasions. John led the Australian (AUS-1) Urban Search and Rescue Team for 15 years and has assisted more than 20 countries in Urban Search and Rescue capability development. John is currently co-chairing an international team coordinated by the United Nations to review coordination and assurance standards for global disaster assistance. In addition to formal fire and emergency management qualifications, he holds two master's degrees, is a Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and has been awarded the Australian Fire Service Medal.




